

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

\$7.9 Million =

\$20 per month on a \$250,000 home (20 years)

The \$7.9 million will provide the District with bond funds to update and improve current infrastructure, classrooms, ADA upgrades and programming space such as STEAM, Maker Spaces, and our Media Center.

WHY DOES PENNOYER NEED A 7.9 MILLION DOLLAR REFERENDUM?

Pennoyer SD79 will have a referendum question on the November 8 ballot that would fund improvements and updates to current infrastructure, classrooms, ADA upgrades and programming space such as STEAM, Maker Spaces, and our Media Center. These improvements will impact our current learners as well as our future students.

Aging Facility

This bond would provide funding for capital improvements needed to maintain Pennoyer School for future generations.

- We cannot continue to pay for capital projects out of our reserve funds.
- We need to ensure our entire school is ADA accessible.
- Systems that would be upgraded/improved and brought to date are: gym & MPR HVAC, bathrooms & water fountains, building fire alarm, ADA upgrades to include an elevator.
